



**International violinist Tasmin Little joins the Vivace Chorus' concert at G Live on March 7.**

# Star violinist all set for G Live

VIVACE Chorus welcome international star Tasmin Little to perform one of the best-loved of all works for solo violin, at their concert at G Live, Guildford on Saturday March 7, at 7.30pm.

Tasmin has performed on every continent in some of the world's top venues including New York's Carnegie Hall, Amsterdam's Concertgebouw, the Vienna Konzerthaus as well as our own Barbican and South Bank centres and the Royal Albert Hall. She is renowned for her ability to communicate her own enormous enthusiasm and passion for music. The opportunity to hear her play the beautifully melodic and romantic Mendelssohn *E minor Violin Concerto* live is certainly one not to be missed.

Tasmin's performance of the concerto will fill the first half of the concert and will be followed with plenty more to thrill and delight the audience.

Baritone Henry Neill will join Vivace Chorus for a performance of Delius' wistful *Sea Drift* which accompanies the poems

of Walt Whitman with some incredibly lush orchestral colours. *Songs of the Fleet* by CV Stanford brings a patriotic touch to the programme and we stay with the theme of the sea for Mendelssohn's *Hebrides Overture* - commonly known as *Fingals Cave* - which cleverly captures the rolling motion of Mendelssohn's boat as he visited the landmark on his journey through Scotland.

Another Mendelssohn favourite, *Hear My Prayer*, will feature treble Thomas Delgado Little in the famous solo *Oh for the wings of a dove*. Thomas sprang to fame when he impressed the critics as Miles in Britten's *Turn of the Screw* at Glyndebourne.

The Brandenburg Sinfonia will provide expert and sensitive accompaniments to all, under the accomplished direction of Vivace's musical director, Jeremy Backhouse.
