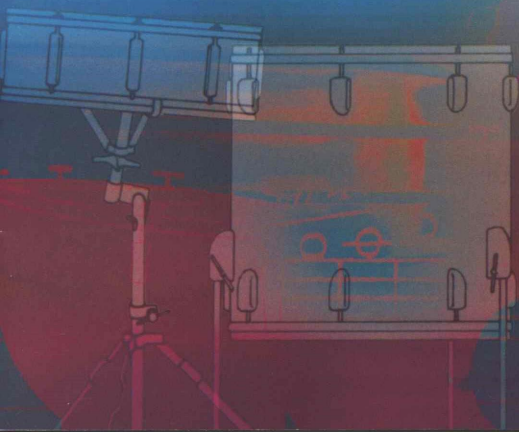

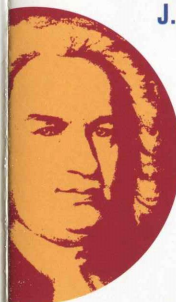

The Magnificat in D, written in 1723 for St Thomas's Church, Leipzig, is one of J.S. Bach's most joyful and ecstatic compositions, large-scale in design and richly scored, with three trumpets adding exuberance to the texture. Nicholas Kraemer, internationally-renowned for his performances of Bach, returns to Guildford for this celebratory programme in the ideal setting of Holy Trinity Church, built during the last few years of Bach's life.

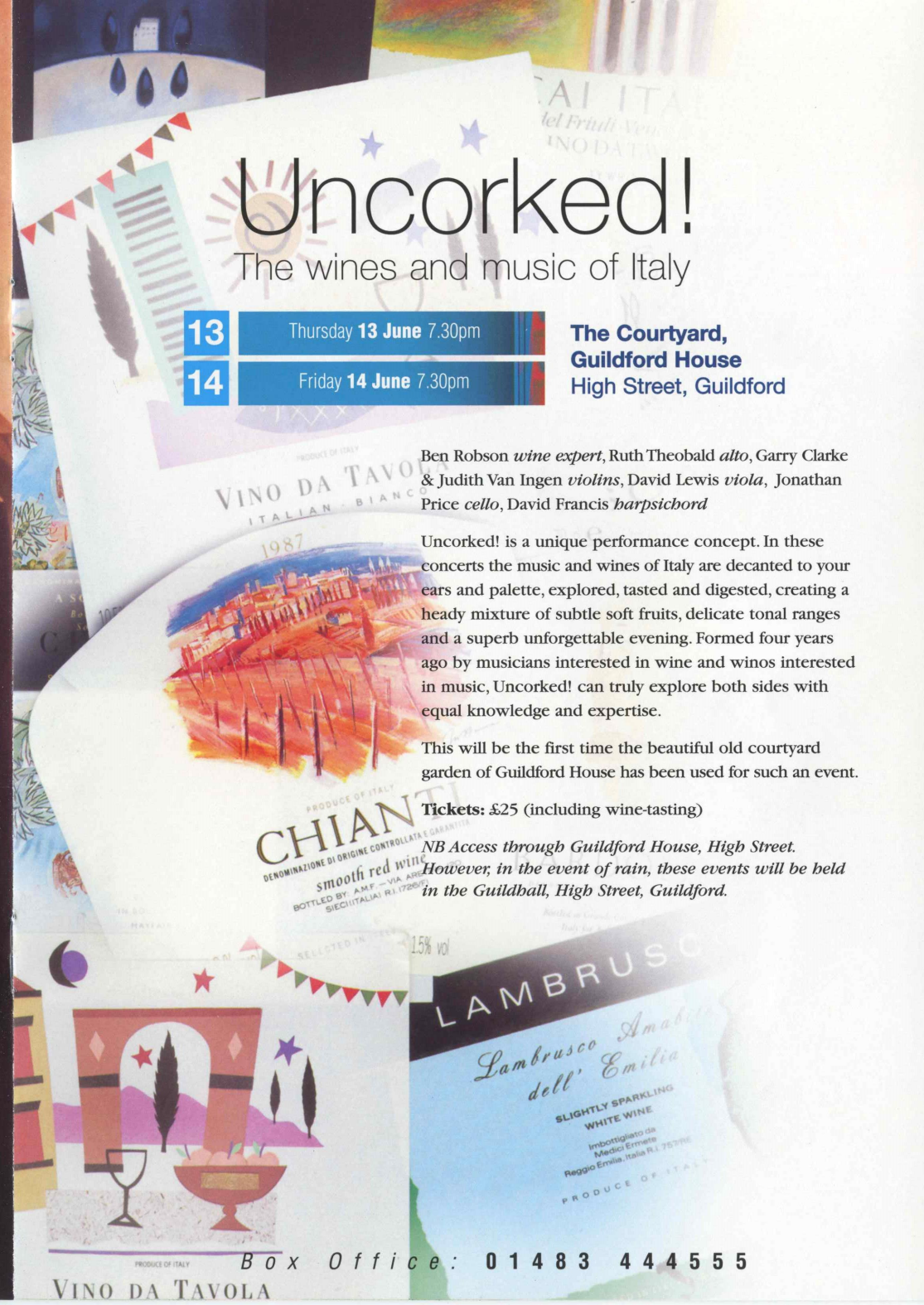

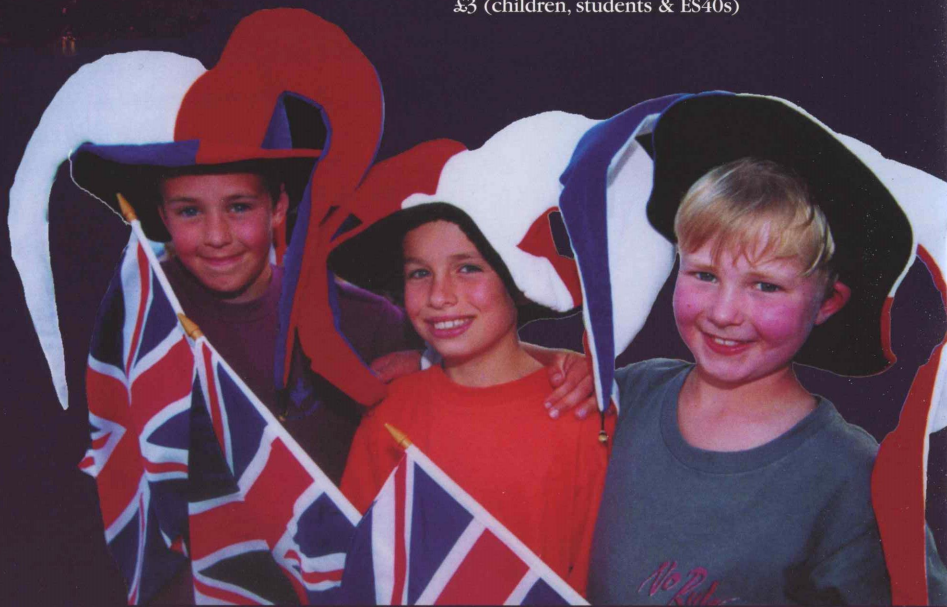


